Augustine

Pastor Larry Coulter Mondays, 1:30 pm - 2:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall

Augustine is on every short list of most influential Christian theological thinkers and writers. For those who seek to grapple with the great theological themes of the Trinity, creation, humanity, history, sin, grace, and eschatology, etc., Augustine is your guy. In this class, we will trace Augustine's life from birth to youth, his education, his 'conversion' to ordination as bishop, then his later days until death. We will explore the basics of his philosophy/theology on freedom and grace, salvation and predestination, ecclesiology and liturgy and, perhaps the most important of all, the Trinity. Sound heavy? No worries! One of the marks of Augustine is that he is eminently understandable and readable. Join us. Six one-hour sessions beginning February 27.

Prayer: A Conversation with God

Prayer is the most spiritually significant thing you can do for yourself and others. You'll practice what you learn, and you'll get handouts to use at home. Six 90-minute sessions beginning February 21.

The Journey from Heartache to Hope Bible Study

In this class based on their new devotional book, *The Journey from Heartache to Hope*, Alane Pearce and Laura Savage-Rains will help you discover the experiences of biblical characters who found hope through their encounters with God, in spite of the heartaches they faced. Alane and Laura will teach you spiritual practices that will sustain you through the tough times. This course is open to both men and women. Six 90-minute sessions beginning February 22.

The book is \$13 and you may either pay for it with registration and pick it up on the first day of class or you may purchase it on Amazon and have it delivered to your home.

Biblical Citizenship in Modern America

Each week, we'll begin with an introduction to the week's class and then take a journey through the Bible & American history to rediscover the secret sauce that produces a prosperous society when biblical principles are applied. We will visit experts across the nation, visit the amazing library of David Barton where we'll find the world's largest private collection of America's Founding Era documents, and then we'll dive into the U. S. Constitution in the very room where it was framed – Independence Hall in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Eight 90-minute sessions beginning February 23.

Additional fees: \$20 paid with registration for a workbook which will be provided on the first day of class.

Balance and Fall Prevention

This series of classes is designed to help you improve your balance, hand-eye coordination and mobility. God's power to transform us is highlighted as the balance of body-mind-spirit directs our lives. Five two-hour sessions beginning February 22.

Centershot (Archery)


Joseph P. Stallone..... Thursdays, 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall
