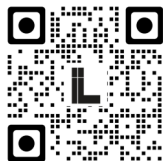
Check out the courses offered this semester, register for your choices, and join us for an experience of becoming a learner for life. We always welcome recommendations for course offerings and instructors.

School of Biblical Studies

Prayer: Conversation and Communion with God

Prayer is the most spiritually significant thing you can do for yourself and others. In this course, you will learn methods of prayer that will make your prayer time with God more enriching and powerful. You'll learn how to align your prayers with God's will, to assure they are answered. And you'll learn to make your prayers for others more effective. You'll practice what you learn, and you'll get handouts to use at home. Six 90-minute sessions beginning February 26.

The Book of Ruth

The Book of Ruth is like one of those movies that you just want to watch, re-watch, and then ponder. It's a magnificent story that grabs us with tragedy, drama, and tension. But it is far more than just a cool story. We will explore the cultural contexts that will make its story (and other parts of the Bible, too!) even more vivid for us, and consider its theological implications for us today.

The Feasts of Israel

Pastor Brent Graham Wednesdays, 2:00 PM – 3:00 PM in Rm 203/204 in the Fellowship Center

This course will provide the student with a better understanding of the seven annual feasts of Israel found in Leviticus 23 and how Jesus Christ is found in each of these feasts. There are three springtime feasts — Passover, Unleavened Bread, and Firstfruits — all illustrate the redemptive accomplishments of Jesus' first coming. The fourth, Pentecost, speaks of the advent of the Church, the body of Christ. In the fall, September/October, comes Trumpets, the Day of Atonement, and Booths. These focus our attention on the future advent of Christ, His second coming and the consummation of God's redemptive plan. We will begin with Sabbath, which is celebrated weekly. Sabbath rest is really the theme and goal of plan.

Mission Culinary Tour

Pastor Danny Hartmann Mondays, 11:30 AM - 1:00 PM in Fellowship Center - Kitchen

This class will incorporate three parts: Cooking international cuisine, learning Biblical concepts of Global Missions, and getting to know our Missions partners. We will pick a different region for each class, learn about our missionaries there, and cook (and eat) authentic food from that location. Participants will enjoy a themed appetizer pre-made by Danny and a traditional beverage from that region while helping to prepare a main dish for the group. Participation will be interactive but not overly involved – Zero cooking expertise required! Get ready for Central American pupusas with curtido, Indonesian nasi goreng with sambal, African peri-peri shrimp with sadza/muriwo, and Indian paneer tikka masala with naan. Four 90-minute sessions beginning February 26.

The Case for the Unhurried Life

Main Idea: We must re-assess the way we spend our time so that we can find a healthier, holier lifestyle.

Head Change: To know that hurry sabotages our ability to give and receive love with God and our neighbors. **Heart Change:** To feel a desire to slow down, matching the rhythm of life Jesus modeled.

Life Change: To manage our daily activities in a way that makes space for loving God and loving others.

Every session has a point and each participant should walk away from the discussions knowing, feeling, and doing. Six 90-minute sessions beginning February 28.

Balance and Mobility

Balance and mobility are essential components of everyday life. Good balance gives us the confidence to do everyday activities without fear of falling. Good mobility allows us to move more freely with less stiffness. This class is composed of flowing movements – quick and slow – done barefoot, increasing awareness in our feet and strengthening our ankles. We work on spine, shoulder, hip mobility and core strength and posture. You walk away from each class feeling taller and lighter, lengthened and strengthened. Six 75-minute sessions beginning February 27.

Instructor will give choices of stretching band at first class.
