Journey into the Cultural World of the Bible

The events/stories in the Bible took place thousands of years ago in a time and culture very different from our own. We will learn about life in the Roman Empire, its honor/shame dynamics, its patronage/reciprocity protocols, and much more, which will shed cool new light on familiar Biblical passages. Join us as we strive to become better readers of the Biblical text in its context. Six 75-minute sessions beginning October 14.
